



## Palmyra, NY – Full Day Tour – Option 1

This full-day tour (total of 9 hours) gives the visitor a complete tour of the attractions of Palmyra and also allows them to spend time either on a cruise of the Erie Canal or shopping at an outlet mall nearby.

The tour begins at the Smith Family Farm where the visitor experiences life in upstate New York in the 1800's and learns more about the founder of the Mormon Church, Joseph Smith Jr.



The visitor then gets to experience the quaint downtown of Palmyra. Spend time shopping along Main Street and enjoy the many antique stores and boutiques. Be sure to also visit the intersection in which there are four different churches on each corner. Then sit outside of a local restaurant and eat lunch with the Erie Canal right next to you.

The tour then has two options: either spend the rest of the day at the nearby Waterloo Outlets or take a cruise on the Erie Canal. Both give the visitor a very relaxing and fun experience.

This full-day tour (total of 10.5 hours) allows the visitor to enjoy both history and nature.

The tour begins by visiting the three different museums that the village of Palmyra has to offer. Each museum gives a unique view of what makes Palmyra such an important town in history. This history includes the religious fervor of the 1800’s and the building of the Erie Canal (making Palmyra a major port).



The visitor then gets to experience the quaint downtown of Palmyra. Spend time shopping along Main Street and enjoy the many antique stores and boutiques. Be sure to also visit the intersection in which there are four different churches on each corner. Then sit outside of a local restaurant and eat lunch with the Erie Canal right next to you.

The tour then travels to the beautiful Watkins Glen State Park. Watkins Glen State Park is the most famous of the Finger Lakes State Parks, with a reputation for leaving visitors spellbound. Within two miles, the glen's stream descends 400 feet past 200-foot cliffs, generating 19 waterfalls along its course. The gorge path winds over and under waterfalls and through the spray of Cavern Cascade. Rim trails overlook the gorge.

The visitor will then get to enjoy shopping and eating on Main Street Palmyra. Main Street Palmyra is filled with great antique shops, boutiques, local crafts, and small-town restaurants.

Finally, the visitor will learn the workings of an old-time print shop while touring the E.B. Grandin Building. With hands-on instructions on the process of printing books in the 1800's, this is a fascinating experience for everyone.

This two-day tour allows the visitor to experience the Canandaigua Wine Trail, Watkins Glen State Park, and the Amish community.

Spend the first day experiencing the famous Canandaigua Wine Trail. The Canandaigua Wine Trail is a collection of unique wineries found along the western edge of the world-famous Finger Lakes Wine Region in New York State. It features many outstanding wines, a variety of shops attractions and restaurants and some of the region's



most spectacular scenery overlooking beautiful Canandaigua Lake. You'll find more than just great wine along this trail.



On your return from the wine trail, you will enjoy a full catered dinner at the Palmyra Inn in its great dining room which can hold up to 85 people.

The next day a visitor will spend half the day at the beautiful Watkins Glen State Park. Watkins Glen State Park is the most famous of the Finger Lakes State Parks, with a reputation for

leaving visitors spellbound. The gorge path winds over and under waterfalls and through the spray of Cavern Cascade. Rim trails overlook the gorge.

The rest of the day will be spent at an Amish farm called Weaver View Farm. Magical history abounds in the Finger Lakes region, never more so than on this 128 acre farm overlooking the West Shore of Seneca Lake. The 14-room farmhouse has a collection of useful, old-fashioned wares and one-of-a-kind country gifts. Almost two hundred years old, the farm offers a tranquil moment in a busy world.
